We have just returned from vacation in Alaska and Canada. What a wonderful trip!

With the Fourth of July just ahead, let me share with you another event from July 4, 1776. On that day the same Continental Congress that declared independence from the King of England formed a committee. Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, and John Adams were charged with developing a great seal for the new United States of America.

Both Jefferson and Franklin, independently of one another, suggested that the imagery on the seal should include the biblical Exodus. Here is another case of religious beliefs from the Judeo-Christian tradition influencing the thoughts of the founders. Franklin suggested that the seal should depict Moses on the shore of the sea, with Pharaoh and his soldiers caught in it, and the pillar of cloud and fire as a sign of God's involvement and approval. He also suggested words to go around the seal: Rebellion to Tyrants is Obedience to God.

Remember this when you hear that the founders of our country weren't really Christians, but deists, and when you hear that "separation of church and state" means anything important to believers must be censored from public display. Christians are to be involved in government for the better of all, and that cannot mean abandoning our beliefs first.

World Food Crisis July 2018
